



## Who we are

Moorlands is a neurological hospital for men and women over the age of 18 years, who have an acquired brain injury, or other neurological conditions. The centre has been designed to support people who, because of their injury, have challenging and complex needs and require a neurobehavioural rehabilitation programme.





The spacious accommodation at Moorlands is made up of three wards, each with ensuite bedrooms. Fern and Heather, each provide eight-beds for men and Foxglove has 10 beds comprising of eight mixed gender beds within the ward and an additional two flatlets providing individual support. The Service is designed around two enclosed courtyard areas with various communal and therapy spaces including a family/multi-faith room and café for patients. Moorlands is set in beautiful countryside with over three acres of grounds and overlooks the Staffordshire Moorlands. Located in Cheadle, Staffordshire, the town enjoys excellent facilities and amenities with a wide range of shops, cafés and a leisure centre. The service is registered as an independent hospital and can support people who may be detained under a section of the Mental Health Act 1983 (amended 2007) as well as those who may be subject to DOLS and informal admissions.



## Neurobehavioural Care

We are committed to providing the highest standard of care and rehabilitation. Person-centred programmes of neurobehavioural rehabilitation encompass the physical, psychological, emotional, behavioural, and social needs of each patient. We work closely with the person's family and supporters as this is a key element of a successful and long lasting rehabilitation.

Moorlands aims to manage or decrease neurobehavioural disability and other consequences arising from acquired brain injury whilst keeping the patient safe and maximising individual choice.



## Goals

The principal goals of neurobehavioural rehabilitation:

- **Formulation of needs to inform risk management and care planning**
- **Therapeutic environment and social climate that maximises opportunities for positive behaviour and optimal achievement of skills**
- **Individual and group therapies to promote skill development and quality of life**
- **Effect changes to support patients in the least restrictive environment possible to move through Elysium neurological care pathways and where possible, to live back in the community**

## People we support

Each person is different, so too is every brain injury and the recovery journey that follows. Whilst we list the inclusion criteria for admission into Moorlands Neurological Centre, whether we can support a patient depends on the social climate and current patients within the centre at any one time.

Minimum set of inclusion criteria:

- **Adults over the age of 18 years**
- **Those in the post-acute stage of brain injury recovery displaying challenging behaviour**
- **Individuals who are medically stable**
- **Where an individual's neurobehavioural disability excludes them from mainstream programmes**
- **Where an individual's rehabilitation is not sustainable in a community setting**
- **Assessed as having new learning ability and potential to benefit from neurorehabilitation**
- **Individuals requiring longer term behavioural support**





## Outcomes

Evaluation of the effectiveness of therapeutic programmes takes place through use of observational recording measures, behavioural recordings, discipline specific measures and clinical supervision. Progress is routinely reviewed at weekly clinical review meetings.


Industry recognised outcome measures are routinely completed on admission, at major reviews of progress and at discharge. Together these measures underpin goal planning and track responses to rehabilitation. These measures also enable the creation of service level performance indicators for benchmarking purposes.

## The Team

Our Clinical Team is overseen by Professor Nick Alderman, Senior Clinical Director for Elysium Neurobehavioural Rehabilitation Services. Professor Alderman is acknowledged internationally as one of the foremost experts in neurobehavioural rehabilitation, having over three decades of experience in this field. Expert clinical disciplines at Moorlands Neurological Centre include:

- Psychiatry
- Specialist Nursing and Rehabilitation Assistants
- Clinical Psychology and Assistant Psychology
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Speech and Language Therapy
- Social Work
- Physical Healthcare Nurse (RGN)

Our clinical team is based on site to ensure that each patient receives the specialist interventions and support they need to achieve their individual goals and outcomes.
